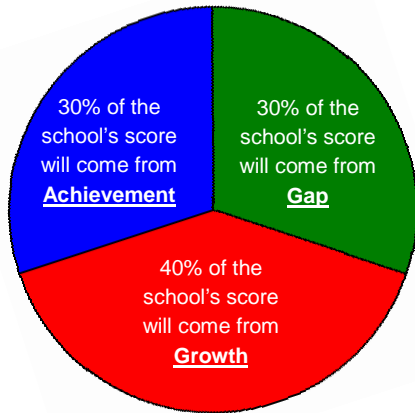

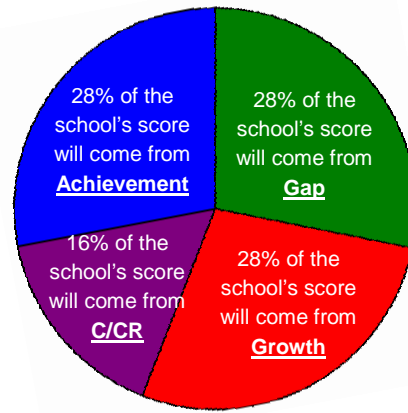

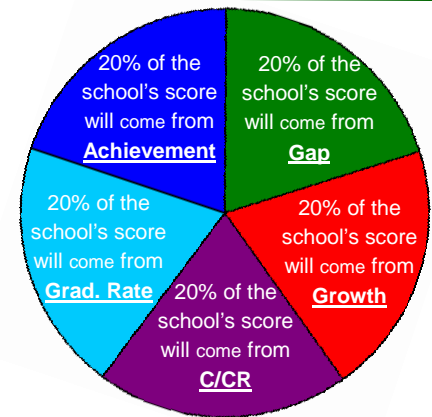

Senate Bill 1 requires Kentucky to begin a new assessment and accountability system. Each district and school will receive a score from the state based upon a 100 point scale. This document outlines how this system will affect district schools.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Calculation of district scores in Reading, Math, Science, Social Studies and Writing • Proficient/Distinguished = 1 point • Apprentice = .5 point • If a student scores distinguished, the school receives an extra one-half point for each student, but novice performance counts for a negative one-half point. 	<p>Kentucky's goal is 100% proficiency for all students. Therefore the gap is the difference between that goal and the actual score (proficient or higher only) from the following groups:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * ethnicity/race * special education * poverty * limited English proficient 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Points are awarded for students who achieve at a typical or high growth level during the same time frame as students in the same grade. • The value is one point for each student showing typical or high growth. • Points are awarded for Reading and Math only.

For students to be college ready, they must meet benchmarks on one of the following:

What is GRADUATION RATE?
 The graduation rate is the difference between the average number of freshmen and sophomores and the number of graduating seniors of the same class.

 Combination of Criterion Referenced Tests (CRT) and National Norm Referenced Tests (NRT), Multiple Choice, Short Answer, and Extended Response Questions

CURRICULUM
 Reading, Math, and Writing from the Kentucky Core Academic Standards (KCAS)
 Science and Social Studies from the Core Content 4.1

STUDENT ACCOUNTABILITY
 In Greenup County, the End of Course exams will count for 10% of a student's final grade.
